








Series Between Mesa And Gilbert Arranged

PHOENIX, March 2 (A)-A threegame basketball' series between Gilbert high school, valley scholastic champions, and the Mesa Jaycees, independent champions of Arizona, to raise funds to send the Gilbert cagers to Chicago for the national scholastic tournament, March 22, was announced today by Owen Allen, Gilbert coach.

The first game will be played at Gilbert Friday night, the second at Phoenix next week, and the final at Mesa two weeks hence. All proceeds will go towards defraying the Gilbert team's expense, Coach Allen stated.

- In their second game Gilbert defeated South High of Minneapolis 27-17. Then they went on to beat Durham, N.C 36-19 and Duval High School of Jacksonville, Fla. 27-25.
- In the semifinals Gilbert lost to Northeast High School of Kansas City, Kan. 24-25 in a game that came down to the finial whistle.
- Gilbert finished the tournament in seventh place and received awards after the final game. A medal and a handshake from sports personality Amos Alonzo Stagg. They were also awarded trophies and a basketball used in the games.





n to Chicago" became the raliying cry as bootters raised money to send Gibber High School's baskethall team to the Windy City for the 1827 National Sankethall Teornament.

"Dances, carnivals, exhibition games between the team and a Mess Juneo of Chamber of Commerce team, auctions and every conceivable money-raising event were staged, said John Freestone, now 76 and one of the team's members. "Many citizens made simble contributions."

The Phoenix Chamber of Commerce wanted to make sure Arizona would receive attention, so team members and coaches were presented with hage cowboy hats with a gold band bearing the inscription, "Gilbert, Arizona," in black letters. They also were given copies of a state seeg, "Arizona,"

and there were a couple of into the then-fashionable Windorsmere East Hotel.

"It was a posh place, and just taying there was an experience a country boy never forgets," Freetone said.

"One day, a very gracious lady got on the elevator with in. She mixed aboest where were frost and what we were doing in Chiengo. After we ranched the lobby and she stepped off the elevator, the operator told us she was Edna Ferber, the noted novelist."

Play in the national tournament at the University of Chicago field house bugan on Monday and continued through the week, with the final games on Saturday night.

Every time Gilbert took the floor, the team faced a state champion.

In the first game, Gilbert, hamrered by stage fright, lost to the s-risted, Conn., team, 16-19.

(Manushile, Safford, entered in the tourismunt as Arizosa's 1927 state champion, defented Franklin, N.H., 30-20, then fost to London, Ky., 20-29, and returned home.)

Gilbert stayed for the complation by, defeating South High of

stipulations. The players and coaches had to step out of their railroad car and sing the song at stops along the way, and they had to return the hata to the chamber upon their return.

"We sang the song in several states," Freestone said. "And what we lacked in harmony, we made up in volume, Some of them couldn't

The two points scored by Freeatone in this game spelled the difference.

"The ball was in the air at the final whistle," Freestone said. "It came down in the Kanasa City basket, and they beat us by one mint."

Overall, Gilbert had finished in seventh place and was among eight teams to receive awards after the final game.

"Each of us received a modal and a handshake from that great coach and aports personality, Amoa Alonso Stagg," Procestone said, "The baskethells used in the games won by the team, as well as other trophies, are still on display at Gibert High School."

But there was no question about the basketball ability of Tom Scott, Gove Allen, Melvin "Mose" Cooper, Merrill Brookins, Bill Ashby and Frestone, all seniors, and Lowell Callahan, a freshman.

Their coach was Owen Allen, His assistant was Donald Sheldon.

Bob Thomas, who had taken a Mesa Union High School team to Chicago a year earlier, suggested to Coach Allen that it would be best for the players to stay in a hotel rather than in one of the fraternity houses.


Scott received a baskethall scholarahip to the University of Southern California. He stayed one year, then returned home and became a farmer. He is deceased.

Quick Basketball History Facts

-The game of basketball was invented in 1891 in Springfield, Massachusetts by a Canadian physical education instructor James Naismith -The first games were played with peach baskets and a soccer style ball, and each team had 9 players. The first game was played on December 21, 1891

-In in 1906 metal hoops, nets and backboards were introduced. In 1894 the soccer ball was replaced by a ball Naismith contracted Spalding to make.

-The first professional league was founded in 1898. Six teams took part in the National Basketball League, and the first champions were the Trenton Nationals

-Originally, basketball courts were built with chicken wire lining. This was to prevent falling into the stands -The Basketball Association of America (BAA) was founded on June 6, 1946, in New York City.[29] The league adopted the name National Basketball Association (NBA) in 1949 after merging with the rival National Basketball League (NBL)
